Currently Needed Items:

- Vegetables: Corn, carrots, mixed veggies
- Microwaveable items: single-serve dinners, soup, chili, mac and cheese cups (no boxes or packets that require pots/extra ingredients please)
- Pasta: Canned pasta with sauce, ramen noodles
- Breakfast/Snacks: Protein or granola bars, single-serve cereal boxes, pop tarts, individual packs of crackers, oatmeal packets, individual boxes of juice or shelf-stable milk
